Avondale University CROSS-CULTURAL COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT PRIZE

Purpose of the Prize

The award is known as the Cross-Cultural Community Engagement Prize (est. 2003 as the Overseas Volunteer Service Prize). It is granted each year to a student (or group of students) that has volunteered in a cross-cultural setting. The prize is to encourage, acknowledge, and celebrate the contribution of Avondale University student volunteers, and enhance the "Avondale experience".

Selection Criteria

The prize will be awarded to students who:

- are enrolled in a Diploma, Undergraduate or Post-graduate course at Avondale;
- 2. have participated in domestic (D/CE) or international community engagement (I/CE) in an exemplary manner;
- 3. show commitment to cross-cultural understanding and collaboration;
- 4. exercise leadership of fellow students or community members;
- 5. demonstrate a commitment to Avondale's values and ethos;
- undertake short-term or long-term volunteer experiences with Seventh-day Adventist entities such as ADRA,
 Adventist Volunteer Services, One Mission, Ministry of Teaching Overseas (MOTO) <u>or</u> other entities approved by
 the Avondale Community Engagement Committee (ACEC).

Note: the annual prize may be awarded to more than one individual where two equally deserving students qualify in a given year, or where a group demonstrates their eligibility. In such cases the prize of \$500 will be split equally.

Administration of Prize

Administration of the prize is guided by the following:

- 1. Individuals or groups may be nominated by members of staff or representatives of ACEC's partner organisations.
- 2. ACEC will determine recipients of the prize.

Sponsorship

The prize is sponsored and funded by the late Marion and Cyril Youlden, and Anna Rieger. It is drawn from a \$10,500 establishment fund (2003) managed by Avondale University; annual disbursements are funded by accruing interest and/or supplements. The prize shall be provided by way of a pre-paid gift card to the value of \$500 and accompanied by a commemorative certificate.

Presentation of Prize

The prize will be presented during the year-end graduation ceremony. Prize recipients who are not graduating in the current year will receive their prize at the *Welcome to Avondale* ceremony at the commencement of the next academic year.
